

NBCUSA H.O.P.E. Overview

In Spring 2010, three North Mississippi NBCUSA state congresses - The New Educational State Baptist Congress of Christian Education, The Original North Mississippi Baptist State Congress of Christian Education (now The Mid-South Churches Baptist State Congress of Christian Education), and the Northeast Mississippi Baptist State Congress of Christian Education, joined forces to host Unity Conference 2010. Health and wellness were the central focus of the conference. The Rising Sun Usher federation of Northwest Mississippi initiated and directed the Unity Conference's health and wellness efforts.

Members of the National Baptist Congress Staff were the conference special guests. After seeing the scalability opportunities for the Unity Conference's health and wellness efforts, they asked the Unity Conference co-chair Dr. Michael O. Minor to begin work on integrating efforts into the National Baptist Congress' National Health Fair.

After participating in the Congress' National Health Fair in 2010, Dr. Waddles asked Dr. Minor to expand these efforts into a year-round initiative. They saw the need for sustained year-round health ministry. Dr. Minor presented an overview of what this proposed initiative to the NBC leadership team. On Thursday, September 9, 2010, Dr. Waddles asked Dr. Minor to implement and

lead this effort. Dr. Minor gladly accepted and H.O.P.E. was born.

After Dr. Julius Scruggs launched the NBCUSA's Federal Faith-Based Initiative in January 2012, H.O.P.E. became an auxiliary of the parent body. NBCUA H.O.P.E. developed as a collaborative effort of National Baptist churches, medical professionals, and health related organizations committed to health outreach and prevention education (H.O.P.E.). They formulated a vision, mission, and challenge to guide their efforts:

Vision. To see a day when all National Baptist churches will have vibrant health and wellness ministries resulting in members being good stewards of their health and wellness.

Mission. To achieve this vision by reaching across our denomination to inspire and enable our fellow National Baptists to commit to healthier lifestyles through

- health and wellness education;
- resource materials and services;
- support networks of trained resource persons and facilitators; and
- evidenced based outcomes assessment

Challenge. To make the NBCUSA the healthiest major denomination in America over the next ten years as measured by the ABCS (aspirin use for those needing it, blood pressure, cholesterol, and smoking cessation)

The work of the NBCUSA H.O.P.E. Health Ministry was established on the foundation of wholeness. They view wholeness through the lens of Trinity Wellness, being whole – mind, body, and spirit. In keeping with our theme of Trinity Wellness, they have organized H.O.P.E. into the following major emphasis areas with supporting national initiatives:

- Mental Health
- Physical Fitness
- Faith and Health

Regional Approach

To facilitate its national reach, the NBCUSA H.O.P.E. Health Ministry has adopted the SSPB's regional structure. Morris Street Baptist is included in the Southeast Region. Sister Brooklyn Rogers is our Southeast Regional Coordinator covering Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia. Our own Sister Garcia Williams is the Ambassador covering the State of South Carolina.

State Approach

To facilitate the national reach and focus as Ambassador, Sister Garcia Williams will be supporting our Health Ministry while reaching out to other churches throughout the state and in Charleston County to focus on the Mission, Vision and Challenges of NBCUSA H.O.P.E. Her goal is to achieve positive results and improved health outcomes with an emphasis on national programs such as:

- Let's Move National Baptist!
- My Brother's Keeper
- The NBCUSA H.O.P.E. Health Ministry Training
- A Better Way (ABW)
- The Church and Community Garden Project

To reinforce Morris Street Baptist commitment to health and wellness, we will feature in future issues of the Victorious Vessel a variety of updates on these and other health related topics.
